Main purpose of the post:

To contribute to the provision of high quality Limudei Kodesh learning and teaching for children at the school, ensuring maximum success for all. To be a role model for the school community and raise levels of pupil achievement. To be actively involved in the setting up of Yavneh Primary School

Specific duties:

General

Work closely with the SLT to ensure that the visions and ethos for Yavneh Primary School are effective and pertinent to all aspects of school life

Be an outstanding practitioner and carry out the functions of a teacher in accordance with the Teacher Standards and the stated aims and objectives of the Yavneh Primary School

To establish good relationships with staff, parents and children

To work with the Kodesh team to bring the Limudei Kodesh curriculum to life for pupils

To promote the Jewish ethos of the school

Support the schools policies and actively promote high levels of achievement in the early years foundation stage, KS1 and KS2

Main Duties

Plan and deliver a child centred creative and stimulating curriculum

To teach classes, groups or individual groups as assigned by the head of LK or a member of the SLT

Ensure the curriculum supports a range of learning styles and develops children's independence

Ensure curricular policy development is focused on continuous improvement

To ensure a close match between the learning experiences offered, and the individual needs of the children in the class, so as to give each child an opportunity to achieve to the maximum of his/her capability

Work with colleagues in developing an engaging curriculum

To maintain an attractive and stimulating classroom environment and contribute to making the whole school environment stimulating

Ensure all pupils are able to learn and achieve to the best of their various abilities

To maintain assessment records and report on pupils' progress to senior staff and to parents and carers, in accordance with school policy

Work in partnership with the leadership team to monitor the success of the teaching of the curriculum and manage areas for improvement

Organise opportunities for pupils which are appropriate to the curriculum

Share and model outstanding practice

To maintain good order and discipline among pupils and safeguard their health and safety

Line manage support staff effectively

To make appropriate educational provision for children with SEN and those learning EAL, with support from the SENCo

Attend to the pupils' personal needs and implement related personal programmes, including social, health, physical, hygiene, first aid and welfare matters

Communication

Develop and maintain effective relationships with parents, colleagues, the governing body and the local community

Develop and maintain links with support services

Actively communicate with the local community for opportunities to extend the curriculum and enhance teaching and learning

Ensure parents are well-informed about the Limudei Kodesh curriculum as well as their child's progress and targets

Provide necessary information to the governing body to ensure it meets its responsibilities

Liaise with other colleagues to ensure a smooth transition for all pupils from early years to Key stage 1 and from Key stage 1 to Key stage 2

Additional duties

Promote and safeguard the welfare of all pupils

Ensure a high standard of care for pupils is consistently maintained

Act as a role model
